ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF DIVERSITY AND HUMAN DIGNITY

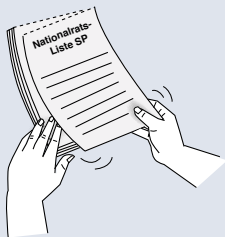
The Swiss population has become particularly diverse. Politicians must acknowledge this new social reality and ensure an equally inclusive society.

VOTING INSTRUCTIONS

The details differ from Canton to Canton. In principle, this is how voting in Switzerland is done.



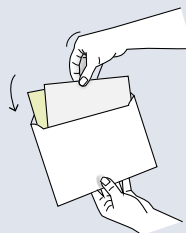
Open the envelope with the voting material.



Take the Social Democrat (SP) ballot list for the National Council (Nationalrat). N.B. You can use only one ballot list!



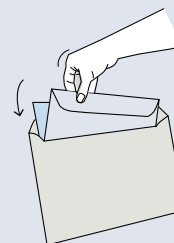
Take the Social Democrat (SP) ballot paper for the Council of States (Ständerat) or, alternatively, write the name of the SP-candidate(s) for the Council of States on the blank ballot paper.



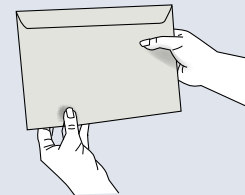
Put both the ballot list and the ballot paper in the (smaller) voting envelope. Close the envelope.



Sign the voter's identification card (Stimmrechtsausweis).



Put both the voting envelope and the voter's identification card in the big envelope. The return address (the municipality) should be visible on the address window.



Return the delivery envelope by mail to the municipal council by October 15, or drop it into the municipal council office mailbox by October 19.
